



General Privacy Notice

Last Updated: June 18, 2026

This Privacy Notice addresses how RTX Corporation and its affiliates and subsidiaries (collectively, "RTX"), may collect and process personal information from you, as an individual, *separate, and apart from its websites and mobile applications*. RTX interacts with individuals in a variety of ways: end users of our products, employees of our business customers and suppliers, and others in our communities. To enable these interactions, RTX may need to collect and process personal information. RTX has implemented technical, administrative, and physical measures to safeguard any personal information we may collect. As this Notice is intended to cover a variety of situations, some information in this Notice may not apply to you. For example, if you do not have a warranty with a RTX company, RTX would not be collecting warranty information from you. Also, RTX complies with applicable legal requirements and refrains from the collection or use of personal information in a location as prohibited by applicable law.

RTX defines personal information as any data that relates to an identified or identifiable person.

What personal information might RTX collect?

The personal information that RTX collects is subject to applicable legal requirements. Because this Notice covers a wide variety of situations, there may be data elements listed here that do not apply to your specific situation. Please contact RTX as described in the “How to Contact RTX” section below if you have any questions.

In countries that impose special protections on sensitive or special Personal Information (as defined by applicable law), RTX will only collect, process, or transfer your Sensitive Personal Information as required by law or, in circumstances where providing the data is optional, with your explicit consent.

RTX will generally collect the personal information from you: when you provide it directly to us; when you use RTX applications, networks, systems and services; and via third parties or our employees (such as a visitor registration form). Our collection of your personal information will be consistent with applicable law.

Except where used in support of a contract with you or to fulfill a legal obligation, our use of your personal information will be only for legitimate business interests as set forth above.

With whom might RTX share the information it collects?

RTX may provide access to or share Personal Information on an as-needed basis with third parties, such as trusted service providers, consultants and contractors who are granted access to RTX facilities or systems, and with government agencies and others as required by law. RTX will only share your Personal Information outside the RTX group of companies to:

- service providers RTX has retained to perform services on our behalf. RTX will only share your personal information with service providers for the purposes listed above. The categories of service providers with which RTX may share your Personal Information include (and only where applicable): contractors assisting with a relevant assignment; denied party screening provider; outsourced digital technology providers; and service providers offering software as a service. RTX will only share your personal information with service providers whom RTX has contractually restricted from using or disclosing your

personal information except as necessary to perform services on our behalf or to comply with legal requirements;

- comply with legal obligations, including but not limited, to complying with tax and regulatory obligations, sharing data with labor/trade unions and works councils, and responding to a court proceeding or a legitimate legal request from law enforcement authorities or other government regulators;
- investigate suspected or actual policy, ethics, or compliance violations or illegal activity;
- prevent physical harm and protect human safety; or
- support the sale or transfer of all or a portion of our business or assets, including through bankruptcy.

If you provide services to a RTX business and need to access a customer or end user's facility, RTX may need to provide your personal information to that customer or end user to facilitate your access to the site in compliance with security requirements.

Except where used in support of a contract with you or to fulfill a legal obligation, our use of your personal information will be only for legitimate business interests as set forth above. RTX will not sell your personal information.

Where does RTX store your personal information?

Because RTX is a global company with locations in many different countries, we may transfer your information from one legal entity to another or from one country to another in order to accomplish the purposes listed above and may include sharing with our services providers in other countries. These countries include, at a minimum, the United States, many of the member states of the European Union, the United Kingdom, Canada, and other countries, including some in Asia. We will transfer your personal information consistent with applicable legal requirements and only to the extent necessary for the purposes set forth above.

RTX relies on available legal mechanisms to enable the legal transfer of personal information across borders and that are intended to ensure an adequate level of protection, as required by law. To the extent that RTX relies on the standard contractual clauses (also called the model clauses) or Binding Corporate Rules to authorize transfer, RTX will comply with those requirements, including where there may be a conflict between those requirements and this Notice. How long does RTX retain Personal Information?

RTX retains personal information for the length of time required to fulfill the purpose for which it was originally collected and for any additional period as required by applicable law or regulation, court, administrative or arbitration proceedings, or audit requirements.

What choices do you have about how RTX uses your personal information?

Where possible, RTX will provide you with the opportunity to decide whether or not to provide your Personal Information. There may be circumstances in which you will not be provided with a choice, such as IT security practices like virus and malware scanning for individuals with access to RTX networks. Depending on the nature of the personal information and the reason that RTX may require it, RTX may be unable to fulfill your request without collecting and processing your personal information.

You will always have a choice about whether RTX uses your personal information for marketing purposes. If you have provided us with your personal information and would now like to request that it is no longer used for marketing purposes, please contact the business from which you are receiving the marketing communications. The communications themselves and the business website will provide you with the contact details. We also encourage you to use the unsubscribe option available in the communication.

What additional information should specific individuals know?

Residents of California: *California Shine the Light Law:* California residents may annually request and obtain information that is shared with other businesses for their own direct marketing use within the prior calendar year. RTX does not share your personal information with other businesses for their own direct marketing use.

California Consumer Privacy Act: California residents have the right to:

- request details about the personal information that we have about you, including the categories of information, the purpose for which we use it, with whom we share it, and specific information about what personal information we have about you;
- request that your data be deleted; and
- direct a company not to sell your data, but, since RTX does not sell personal information, this does not apply.

Please provide your name, a way for RTX to contact you (such as an email address or telephone number) so that we can respond to your request, information about the nature of your relationship with us (for example, are you a visitor to our website or a shareholder), and details about the action that you would like us to take. Based on your request, we will investigate to determine if we have any of your personal information. If we do have your personal information (other than that provided in your request), we will seek to verify your identity based on the personal information that we already have; the data we will request will depend on the nature of the personal information we have about you. We will also provide you information about whether there is any reason we cannot comply with your request.

Residents of the European Union, United Kingdom and other countries with privacy laws: You have the right to lodge a complaint with your national or state data protection authority, which may also be known as a supervisory authority. You also have the right to withdraw consent, to request access to and correction or erasure of your personal information, seek restrictions on or object to the processing of certain personal information, and seek data portability under certain circumstances. To contact RTX about a request to access, correct, erase, object or seek restrictions or portability, please use the contact methods indicated at the end of this notice.

Residents of the United Kingdom Complaints Procedure: If you have a complaint about how your personal information has been handled by RTX, you can submit a data protection complaint to RTX using any of the contact methods indicated at the end of this notice.

We will endeavor to acknowledge receipt of complaints submitted to us within 30 days. We may ask for additional information, including information to verify identity or to clarify the scope of the complaint.

We will take steps to (i) keep you updated on the progress of the investigation, and (ii) let you know the outcome of the complaint without undue delay, taking into consideration the complexity and scope of the complaint.

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of your complaint, or how we have handled your complaint, you also have the right to complain to the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO). For more information about the ICO and their complaints process, please see [Make a complaint | ICO](#).

Residents of the United States: RTX does not collect Social Security Numbers through www.rtx.com. RTX does, however, collect Social Security Numbers where required by law, such as tax and payroll purposes for its employees. When RTX collects and/or uses Social Security Numbers, RTX will take proper care by protecting

confidentiality, limiting collection, ensuring access on a need-to-know basis, implementing appropriate technical safeguards and ensuring proper disposal.

Residents of Australia: Each RTX entity in Australia is an “APP entity” regulated by the provisions of the Privacy Act 1988 (Commonwealth of Australia) (“Australian Privacy Act”). References in this notice to RTX also relate to Australian subsidiaries in relation to all acts and practices of any of them in collection, handling, and disclosure of personal information about individuals in Australia. Where an Australian subsidiary discloses personal information about residents of Australia to an overseas recipient for any of the reasons described in this notice, it will take reasonable steps to ensure that the overseas recipient does not breach the Australian Privacy Act in relation to that information. Residents of Australia may e-mail privacy@rtx.com to access, correct or update your personal information, if you have questions about RTX’ privacy practices in general, or if you wish to make a complaint. If we take more than 30 days to respond or if you are dissatisfied with the outcome, you can make a complaint to the Privacy Commission in the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner by post at GPO Box 5218, Sydney NSW 2001, by telephone at 1300 363 992, or by email at enquiries@oaic.gov.au.

How might RTX change this policy?

As RTX expands and improves this website, we may need to update this policy. If we make any significant changes to the policy, we will post a notice on our websites or contact you to inform you when required by law. By continuing to interact with us after the modified version of the policy has been posted, you are accepting the changes to the policy, subject to any additional requirements that may apply. We encourage you to review this policy on a regular basis for any changes. The date of the latest version will be identified at the bottom of the policy.
